
Our approach - The Everyone Forever (EF)seeks to ensure that reliable and lasting water and sanitation services are brought to every family, community, clinic, and school in a district.


## **Progress in water and sanitation** services in target districts

• Karongi is the newest EF District in Rwanda. After completion of the district WASH investment Plan in 2019, we are now working with the district and the national government to start the implementation of WASH activities, with the aim of bringing safe water and sanitation services to the entire district population within the next 5 years. Baseline data collection was completed in 2017 and showed below WASH



# **RESPONSE TO COVID - 19**

When the novel Coronavirus "COVID-19" broke out, one of the main advices issued was that everybody should wash their hands with soap.

Water For People responded to the crisis swiftly, knowing that our work was much needed more than ever. Water For People was particularly involved in the provision of safe water for communities in target districts through the rehabilitation of existing systems and construction of new ones, serving a total population of over 30 000 people in Rulindo and Gicumbi districts. In addition, over 3,300 frontline workers in Kicukiro and Rulindo districts were provided with personal protective equipment (PPE) while 346,000 people in the districts of Rulindo, Gicumbi, Kicukiro and Nyagatare benefited permanent handwashing facilities built in public places, including hospitals, health centers, bus stations and market places.

Water For People also supported the dissemination of information on COVID-19 through mass media, outdoor messaging and the distribution of printed materials. in the districts of Rulindo and Gicumbi.
