




### **ABOUT WATER FOR PEOPLE**

Water For People is an international nonprofit organization originating from United States of America, Colorado, in Denver, working to bring safe water and sanitation services to people by working with community members, governments, and businesses to find out what they need to be healthy, safe, and empowered.

Water For People has been working in Rwanda since 2008 and partners with the Government, local authorities, communities, businesses, and other stakeholders to provide sustainable safe water, sanitation facilities and hygiene education to communities and public institutions in Rulindo, Kicukiro, Gicumbi, Karongi and Gisagara districts.

Water For People is partnering with the Ministry of Infrastructure and districts to support communities, schools and health facilities to ensure that they have access to reliable, sustainable and safe water and sanitation services.

Ten more districts (Nyagatare, Kayonza, Rwamagana, Ngoma, Kirehe, Nyabihu, Ngororero, Ruhango, Nyanza and Nyamagabe) are supported under the five-year, USAID-funded Isoko y'Ubuzima Project. The purpose of this project is to enhance the institutional strengthening and improve service delivery of water and sanitation services and products.

### **OUR WASH IMPACT MODEL**

Everyone Forever means reliable and lasting water and sanitation services to every family, school, and health clinic in the districts where we work. We partner with local governments, businesses, and individuals, providing the training, tools, and financial support they need to ensure reliable water and sanitation services to current and future generations

Rwanda is the birthplace of the Everyone Forever Model which was born out in Rulindo District in 2010 and adopted by the government of Rwanda under the 'District Wide Approach" banner. The model is also implemented by other Water For People Country Programs<sup>1</sup> across the globe.

Over the past 15 years Water For People reached over one million people with access to safe drinking water services. The investment made over this period in Rwanda is over 46.7 million US dollars.

As a result of that investments, three of the 5 target districts (Kicukiro, Rulindo and Gicumbi) have water infrastructure in all communities, schools, and health care facilities. Over 1,020,000 people in five districts have now access to clean water and sanitation services. We continue to work with the Government of Rwanda and other partners to address sustainability-related challenges.

### 15 YEARS OF IMPACT



Since 2008, Water For People has brought clean water to over a million people in 1,289 villages (communities), schools and health facilities in the target districts of Kicukiro, Rulindo, Gicumbi, Karongi and Gisagara.






